Rail Division appoints new Head of Civils

Ahead of anticipated growth in the second half of Network Rail's CP6 programme, the Rail team have appointed Gary Payne as Head of Civils, as part of a plan to further expand our specialist rail offering to include ancillary civil engineering works. These are typically services our customers welcome as a natural add-on to our piling and geotechnical works, potentially reducing interfaces with other contractors.

HS2 update

We have recently delivered our first rail piling works at Curdworth in partnership work with Balfour Beatty Rail and Pod-Trak, safely installing 44 no. circular hollow section (CHS) piles to extremely precise tolerances to allow steelwork to be installed ahead of the next phase ofthe project.

The foundations allowed for a temporary fence at the site, ensuring further HS2 work could continue alongside live Network Rail lines, where trains can travel up to 120 mile-per-hour.

This follows our vibro ground improvement works for the Skanska Costain Strabag joint venture and Strata, who are now active across the northern part of HS2, are supporting the ongoing ground investigation works.





M42 case study

Our piling works on the M42 at Junction 6 in Birmingham are now completed thanks to a collaborative project with Skanska. Our work involved the installation of bored piles for the new Church Lane Footbridge which will span this very busy section of the dual carriageway.

The improvements are part of a £300m package from Highways England which will improve connections to Birmingham Airport, the NEC and the new HS2 Interchange Station, whilst improving connectivity for the Birmingham Commonwealth Games in 2022.
