Record revenue, improved profitability, and higher return on capital

On the 26th of July, we announced a strong set of results for the year ending 30th April 2023, building on last year's excellent progress.

We reported record revenues of £148.7m with a growth of 19% compared with FY2022, driven by increased activity levels across all divisions.

We delivered an improved operating margin of 3.9% and increased pre-tax profit of £5.4m in the year to April 2023, up from £3.6m previously.

Mark Cutler, Chief Executive, commented: "I am delighted to report a strong set of results, building on last year's excellent progress as we emerged from the pandemic.

Major project underway to support new warehousing complex in Scotland

Work has recently commenced on one of our largest rigid inclusion projects to date, to support a new warehousing complex in Portgordon, Scotland.

Our ground improvement team began installing rigid inclusions for the main contractor, Robertson Group in July.



Once complete the project will support the expansion requirements of William Grant & Sons, a renowned premium spirits company.

The scope of work includes the installation of more than 15,150 rigid inclusions across four whisky storage warehouses, covering an area of 535,000 square feet and designed to support both the foundations and the floor slabs.

Strata opens new sample storage facility at former Pinxton depot

To support its expanding operations, Strata Geotechnics has recently opened a dedicated sample processing and storage facility.

The refurbished workshops offer an ideal space for temperature-controlled storage of all geotechnical samples from ground investigation operations.

Specialist Piling team begin work at Tottenham North Curve

The team are working for AmcoGiffen on behalf of Network Rail installing 52 bored castin-place piles, to stabilise the existing tunnel wall.

During this current phase of work, the team installed 44 x 900mm piles to depths of up to 23.5m, using our specialised lorry mount STM-20 piling rig.

The work presents notable logistical challenges, the location of the work site means that we need to transport all cages approximately 50 meters down a steep incline, navigating a sharp bend near the rail line.

Subsequently, the journey continues along a lengthy 100-meter haul road, which passes under an old Victorian railway tunnel, and then finally onto the site.

In addition to these intricate operations, our team is conducting thermal integrity profiling testing on the scheme to assess the integrity and quality of bored piles.

Strata utilise the VETRACK rig for house renovation in Notting Hill

Strata Geotechnics completed ground investigation works for a house renovation project located in Central London. The team drilled a single 25m borehole to inform pile design for the second phase of work that is due to be carried out by our Van Elle Specialist Piling

To ensure easy and safe access through narrow doorways and entries on site, they utilised our VETRAK Restricted Access Cable Percussion (CP) rig.

Once the rig was at the drilling location, the mast unfolded and drilled using a 6m height mast.

Upon completion of the Specialist Piling works the Strata team will be called back to the site to carry out pile testing, showcasing our full end-to capabilities.
